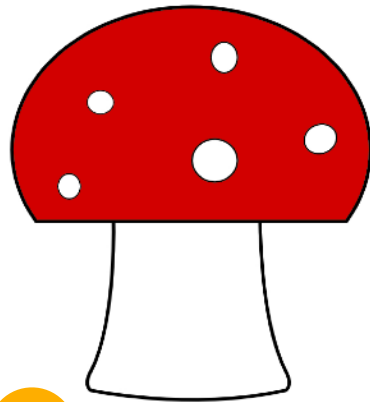


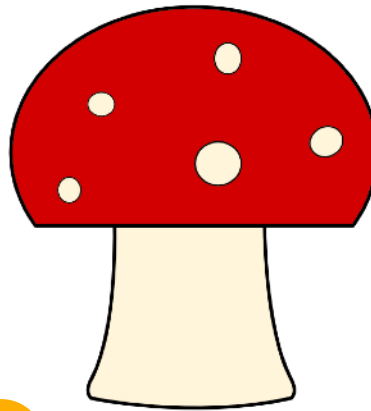


TOADSTOOL

To complete this kit, I used 2 settings of the 4mm lator punch needle. You can play around with the settings to see what you like best. Since they're not marked you can set it to the second hole from the top so you'll only see one above the handle. The background is punched with a setting showing 4 holes on the top and the Toadstool showing 3, meaning the background has a shorter loop and the toadstool longer which makes it stand out!

- (1) Thread your punch needle with the red yarn and punch the top part as shown on setting with 3 holes showing above the handle.
- (2) Keep the same setting and thread the needle with the cream yarn. Fill out the spots on the toadstool and its base.
- (3) Set the needle to one of the shortest settings (showing 4 holes) and thread it with the green yarn. Punch the background.
 - turn the piece over and take a look at the piece as a whole. Snip ends and beginnings of your stitches. Are there any stitches that are much longer than the rest? If so, snip them just like you would when ending a stitch and mix them in with surrounding stitches so they're not as obvious.
 - straighten out the outline by moving stitches around. Detailed video is [here](#).
